NEIGHBORHOOD REVITALIZATION

Neighborhood Revitalization expands Habitat's traditional partnership with new homeowners and volunteers to include neighbors and partnering with local organizations for a far greater impact in the community we serve.

While home construction of affordable housing continues to play a vital role, a bigger toolbox that includes repairs and other services allows Habitat to serve more families in our community.

This program offers a service that helps low income homeowners who can not afford necessary upkeep to preserve their home and remain living with pride and dignity. Homeowners are selected based on income, need, and ability to repay the cost of materials used.



Our Neighborhood Revitalization Programs are *A Brush with Kindness* and *Critical Care*. A Brush with Kindness focuses on minor exterior repairs such as painting, fence repair, gardening. While our Critical Care program focuses on urgent, necessary repairs such as wheel chair accessibility and code violations.
